Founded in 2014 and incorporated as a 501(c) non-profit in 2020, Unadilla Community Farm is an off-grid, solar-powered, non-profit farm education center, situated on 11 acres in West Edmeston, NY. Our mission is to showcase and teach climate-resilient agriculture while increasing food access and access to herbalism for low-income, low-access communities. In 2024, with financial support from the National Black Food & Justice Alliance, the land on which Unadilla Community Farm operates was purchased by the Stolen Lands Community Land Trust to ensure local stewardship and access to the community farm and education center in perpetuity.

Since 2014, we have transformed an abandoned corn field into a multi-story "food forest" that is one of a kind in our region. For the past 11 years, Unadilla Community Farm has run a variety of education programs, including a Permaculture Internship, Farm Fellowship, Community Volunteer Days, and two Northeast SARE on-farm research studies. 294 people from 6 continents have participated in our education programs, with many of them receiving academic credit at the undergraduate or graduate level for completion of our internship.





Through the support of individual donors and institutional grants, we donate 100% of our produce to food pantries, mutual aid groups, and herbal clinics, which in 2024 amounted to over \$120,000 worth of produce donated. By increasing the amount of fresh fruits, veggies, and culinary and medicinal herbs available for low-income, low-access communities, we both improve health and nutrition for communities in need and reduce family food budgets, freeing up family funds for other needs.



Farm Aid

Farm Fellowship

2024 was the 2nd year of our season-long paid Farm Fellowship, an opportunity for beginning farmers with at least one season of farming experience under their belt to skill up and deepen their farming knowledge. Fellows learned the day-to-day operations of a non-profit farm focused on increasing food access and access to herbalism, including how to tend to a food forest, with a focus on growing perennial fruits & herbs, cover crops, and annual vegetables. Seven Fellows participated in this year's program.





Accredited Internship

In 2024, we hosted Louise Fourcade, a graduate student from University of Purpan, France, for an accredited 3-month internship focused on sustainable agroforestry. Through our Beginning Farmer Training Program, we offer accredited internship hours for undergraduate and graduate level students and have hosted students from Arizona State University, Berea College, Colorado State University, Columbia University, Minerva University, Rutgers University, University of Purpan, and more.



Community Engagement

2024 was the 2nd year of our monthly
Community Volunteer Days from MaySeptember and our annual Community Farm
Tour. 52 people participated in these events.
This season's Community Volunteer Days
covered the following topics: Dynamic
Accumulator Plants, Herb Propagation, Garlic
Harvesting, Herb Transplanting, Garlic
Planting, and Garlic Cleaning. The 2024
Community Volunteer Days were made possible
with financial support from the Otsego County
Community Events Grant.

Additionally, local people from the communities we serve are invited to volunteer at the farm on their own schedule and sit in on farm classes. 6 day volunteers helped out this season.

Programs: Food Access

Unadilla Community Farm's Food Access Program provides free nutrient-dense fruits, vegetables, and culinary herbs to food pantries across Central New York.

This season, we donated fresh produce **valued at \$55,314.30** to food pantries in Otsego, Oneida, Herkimer, Madison, and Chenango counties, which included continuing support to our long-term food pantry partners as well as expanding our reach to new food pantries in Madison County and increasing donations in Norwich.

Unadilla Community Farm was one of 22 leading food and farming organizations selected as a recipient of New York State's 2024 Urban Farms and Community Gardens Grant Program. This \$44,610 grant supported our work increasing food access in Central New York through the 2024 Food Access Program.


Programs: Herbal Aid

2024 was the second season of our Herbal Aid Program, which was piloted last year. Through this unique program, we grow and deliver free medicinal herbs to the "food pantry" equivalent in the world of herbal health access: free herbal clinics, community apothecaries, and mutual aid groups. We offer free delivery within a 90-minute radius of the farm as well as free shipping in insulated coolers to organizations beyond our delivery radius. Our partners then utilize our herb donations to provide free herbal services including health & wellness consultations, internal and external herbal preparations, and supplies for home medicine making, particularly for low-income, BIPOC, unhoused, and immigrant communities. In 2024, we donated medicinal herbs and berries valued at \$74,338.87.

We assist our herbal aid partners with filling an important gap by providing free herbal health services to low-income and uninsured people who would otherwise fall through the cracks in the U.S. healthcare system. Additionally, distributing free herbal medicine to marginalized communities serves to reclaim plant medicine traditions that have been historically erased by the for-profit pharmaceutical industry.




Unadilla Community Farm's herbs distributed for free at Herban Cura's Plants to the People event in New York, NY (credit @herban.cura)
